BOE 2026 UPDATES:

CAMPGROUND- Maintenance and improvements continue all year long on the campground. Some of the projects done this year include: repairs to water main breaks (about twice a month), installation of new roof on chapel, replacement of large HVAC unit on Sanctuary, repairing occasional roof leaks, installation of additional security cameras, continual improvements to the Sanctuary video and lighting as well as improved broadcast capabilities, and replacement of the Cafeteria walk-in cooler and freezer.

YOUNG PEOPLES WORK PROGRAM- Thank you to everyone who participated in our Thanksgiving Work Weekend 2025, led by Bro. Derek Robuck. Through the efforts of many dedicated volunteers, significant improvements were made across the campground. Projects included installing new doors and building storage shelves in the Youth Park shed, adding new lighting to the Youth Park, spreading lime throughout the cemetery, repairing and repouring cemetery runners, planting new trees and shrubs in the cemetery and around the nursing home, installing new flooring and trim in the main areas of dorm rooms, replacing exterior doors on several dorm rooms, and trimming trees and clearing brush throughout the grounds. We are grateful for everyone who gave their time and talents to help care for and improve our church facilities. This worked saved the church about \$150,000.

LifeSpring's Church Home has been recognized by U.S. News & World Report as a High Performing nursing home for short-term rehabilitation, placing it among the nation's top facilities. It is one of only five highly rated facilities within 100 miles and the only one in Houston County. The report, based on data from more than 15,000 nursing homes nationwide, also gives high marks to Church Home's long-term care. CABINS/ LOTS/ RV OWNERS

Some things to know and remember as a Lot/Cabin user:

- To secure lot/cabin or release a lot/cabin, contact **Bro. Joe Woods: jwoods@collinsandwright.com or (803) 730-2032**. Please use this same contact information if you would like to update your records with name changes, who should handle your lot/cabin affairs or to whom do you wish, upon approval by the Board of Extension, to transfer your lot/cabin use to upon your incapacitation or death. Bro. Joe will be in the cafeteria most of the day and night Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday of Campmeeting if you would like to meet with him.
- All Water & Sewer payments for 2026 are due by Camp Meeting and can be paid using this [link](#) or mail to the Campground Office, 2500 N. US-41, Fort Valley, GA 31030. Note all payments "water and "sewer". This link and address can also be made for any payment that are in arrears.
- Each lot and cabin user is responsible for paying the Houston County property taxes. To check on the status of your lot or cabin, visit <https://www.houstoncountytax.com/>
- To build a cabin or make structural changes on the Campground, contact **Bro. Mike Gray** for approval. All building permits are obtained by the Church. They cannot be obtained by any individual. Before receiving a permit, submit a plot plan and house plan to the Board of Extension (BOE) via **Bro. Mike Gray**.
- All cabin users may not permit any guest or guests to reside in their cabin for more than thirty (30) cumulative days in any twelve (12) month period without obtaining the permission of the Board of Extension. Please contact Bro. Joe Woods with this request.
- A Lot Use Agreement only allows vacant lots to be held for one year. If you have a vacant lot that you have held for more than one year, please contact Bro. Joe Woods.
- Lot and cabin users should keep their lots and "cabins" and surrounding landscapes in good condition, maintain their structures in good repair, and care for their property in a way that enhances the Campground's beauty and appearance.
- Lots with improvements (cabin etc.) are to maintain property insurance and liability insurance with Christ's Sanctified Holy Church listed as an additional insured on liability policy. Please send of copy of this policy to the Campground office.

FARM- The farm continues to be productive. The older portion of the pecan orchard continues a long-term renovation to replace the older trees. The newest orchard towards I-75 is growing in nicely. The younger trees planted earlier this decade will begin bearing nuts over the next few years. Replacing the older trees (many well over a century in age!) will add generational life to the orchard. Proceeds from the orchard are used to help sustain the Campground.
